The beach area of Lara, approximately 12 kms to the east is home to the best beach in the area, known for its golden sand, which is rapidly becoming a resort in its own right.



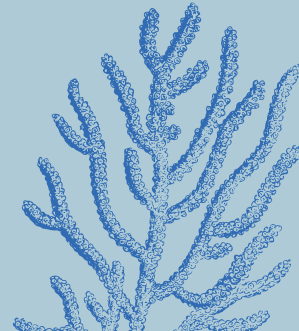

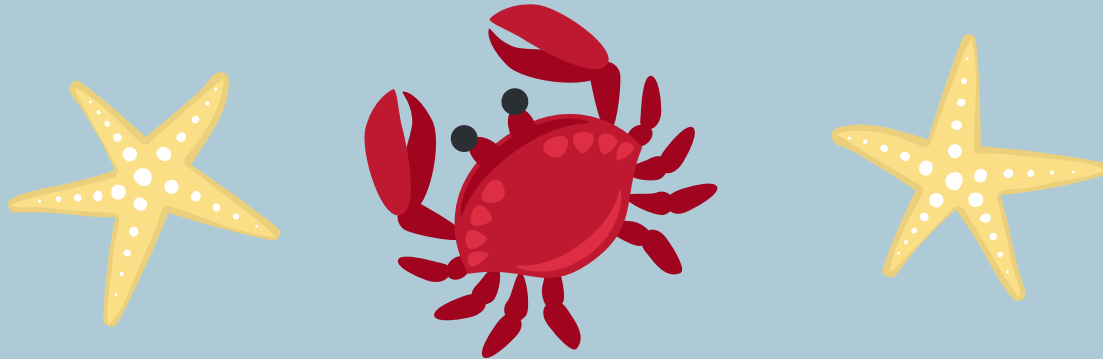
# Belek

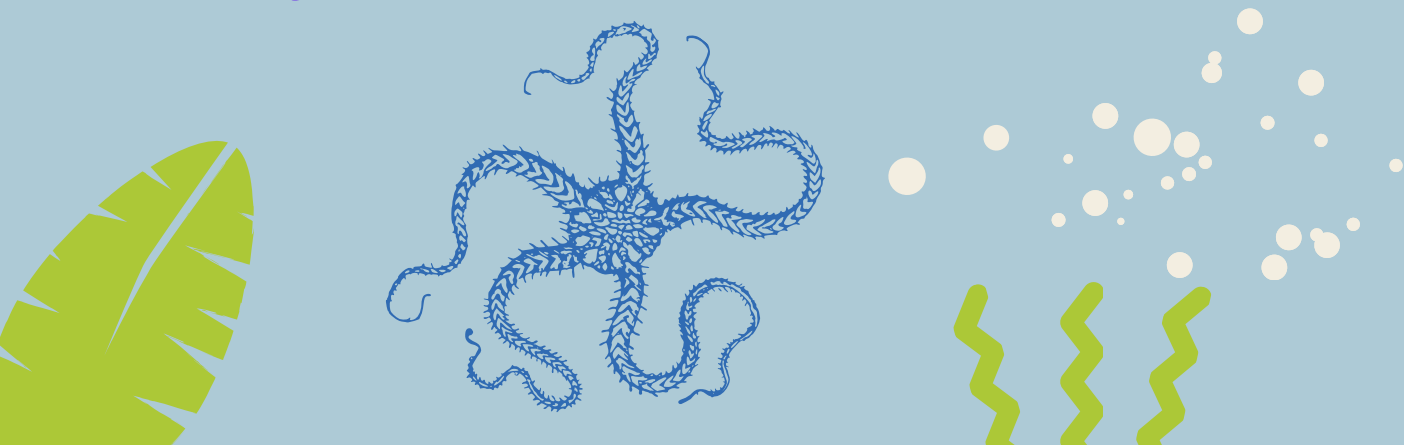
# Alanya

# Kas

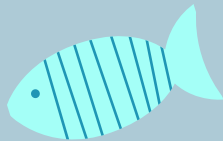
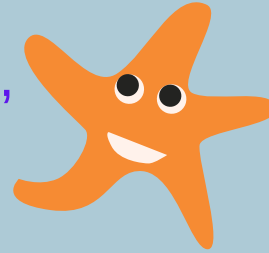

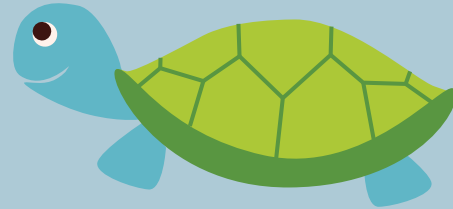
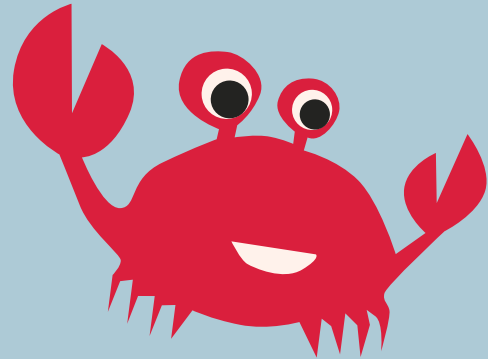
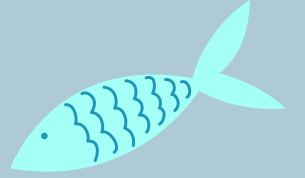


# Kalkan
